

## **SCHOOL DISTRICT ORGANIZATION**

### **School District Legal Status**

The Constitution of Illinois requires the State to provide for an efficient system of high quality public educational institutions and services in order to achieve the educational development of all persons to the limits of their capacities.

The General Assembly has implemented this constitutional mandate through the creation of school districts of various types. The Morton Unit School District 709 is governed by the laws set forth for school districts serving a resident population of not fewer than 1,000 and not more than 500,000.

By recognizing the law, tradition and ethics local school boards have responsibilities to the local citizenry they serve and to the professional personnel they employ. Recognizing this three dimensional concept of source of authority and responsibility, the School Board of Morton Unit School District 709 is the policy making body for the District's schools and serves within the framework provided by law, the will of the local citizenry and the ethics of the professional personnel employed by the School Board.

The school board constitutes a body corporate which possesses all the usual powers of a corporation for public purposes, and in that name may sue and be sued, purchase, hold and sell personal property and real estate and enter into such obligations as are authorized by law.
