Administrative Reports-

- ♦ Superintendent's Report— Dr. Smock
 - ⇒ Dr. Smock thanked Mr. Saunders and the staff at Grundy for an excellent dinner and presentations to the Board of Education showcasing the many good things happening at Grundy School. They did a fantastic job!
 - ⇒ Dr. Smock noted it is a full Homecoming Week. He reflected on the great job our administration and teachers do keeping students focused on learning during Pumpkin Festival, Homecoming and other busy weeks.
 - ⇒ Friday (9/16) was an early release for students. Wellness is a focus this year. After all the staff has been through with Covid, administration felt it was important to give staff an opportunity to connect and reconnect. Building relationships across the district and with new staff, too. We had bags games, pickle ball, walking and talking. There were food trucks for staff to purchase food. Many helped prepare and plan for the day. In a post-Covid world, we need to reconnect. It is one of our initiatives. The event was a success.
 - ⇒ We have submitted the annual Textbook and Material Report prepared by Dr. Teater. Administration presents all of the curriculum materials to the board every year so they are aware of what we are using in our classrooms. Dr. Teater was present to answer a few questions from board members. Mr. Neeley asked about the cost of purchased books compared to rentals. Dr. Krall asked about the current textbooks aligning with standards. Dr. Smock did some quick math showing that the fees charged do not cover the cost of the technology and materials provided to each student.
